The President's Massage

At the last week's board of directors meeting, Dr. Tim Burlingame, Chairman of the Tex Everson Humanitarian Endowment reported to the board the latest financial position of the Endowment. Good news: after a couple years of negative returns, we are in a position to have a positive gain and distribute funds to needy causes. The Endowment will be accepting applications for grants towards the end of the year. If



you know of an organization that is in need, let them know about the Endowment. The Endowment is able to grant up to 50% of the investment gains made during the year. As of June 30, the investment gains were over \$12,000 and a net gain of almost \$16,000. The Endowment has granted over \$44,000 to date and has an account balance of around \$185,000.

The specific purpose of this Endowment is to provide financial support for the sustaining and special charitable projects of the Rotary Club of Covina-Sunrise...in the area of community service, vocational services, and international service. 
