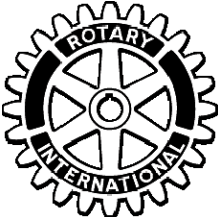

Playing Doctor

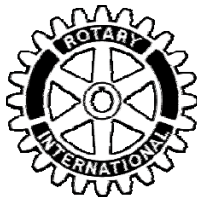
